



Leather Care Instructions

Buffalo and Cow Leather

Leather collars and leashes are designed to last and maintain their beauty for many years. However, as with any natural product, leather collars and leashes need a little care once in a while.

Just as with the purchase of your leather shoes, it is recommended to condition the leather prior to the first wear. Use a soft, clean cloth to apply a small amount of a leather conditioner to protect it from water and the elements. Take a second clean cloth and buff the collar to a shine.

There are many different leather cleaners on the market. One of the most common and inexpensive choices is saddle soap. Simply dip a clean, lightly dampened cloth into the saddle soap and rub the soap into the leather so that it penetrates into the collar. Allow the soap to dry on the collar; follow up by buffing the leather collar with a clean soft, cloth.

Do not leave in the sun to dry.

Once the collar is cleaned to your liking, it is recommended to recondition the leather to keep it soft and serviceable.
